## Foreward

On June 14-18, 2003 about 70 high energy physicists from 20 countries met in the ancient town of Conversano, near Bari, Italy, for the second edition of QCD@Work, International Workshop on Quantum Chromodynamics. The first edition was held in Martina Franca, near Bari, in 2001.

In the Proceedings of the first edition we listed the topics of the Martina Franca Workshop, which we feel can be used to characterize the motivations of the Conversano edition as well: Low energy Physics and non perturbative QCD; Deep inelastic scattering with polarized and unpolarized beams; Jet Physics and perturbative QCD; Heavy quark and heavy hadron Physics; Quark-hadron duality; Quark gluon plasma and the Physics of relativistic heavy ion accelerators; QCD phase diagram at finite temperature and density. This list suggests the aims of QCD@Work 2003; the results of the fruitful discussions are reported in this proceeding volume.
