Errata:

Page 7, second caption. Correct date of dedication is August 10, 1962. (arc034)

Page 7, third caption should be: Aerial photo of SLAC construction taken April 17, 1963 looking from what will be the injector end of the linac toward the Beam Switch Yard. Sand Hill Road appears in the lower left-hand corner of the photo; Jasper Ridge is along the right. (M373)

Page 20, first caption. Replace with: Bubble chamber crew working on the 40-inch bubble chamber. (GA2094/arc3422)

Page 27, third photo. James E. Murray is pictured, not Clive Field. (M2587-08)

Page 30, first photo, correct date is October 8, 1971. (2792)

Page 44, first photo. SSRL Beamline is 1-4, not 1-5 (ssr137)

Page 45, third photo is copyrighted by the Nobel Foundation (GA4578)

Page 46, timeline at bottom of page should indicate that “PEP operations begin, PEP dedicated” occurred in 1980 (not 1983)

Page 83, second image, first photo, caption should be “...recording of the first Z by Mark II.” (arc00247)

Page 85, third image, date in caption should be 1987 (ssr106)

Page 99, first image, date in caption should be October 1992 (misc0217-16)

Page 108, second caption. Replace with: The SLAC S-band klystron, shown here with technician Richard Talley, was developed between 1992 and 1994 for use in an S-band version of a large collider at DESY (in Germany). Robust and practical, the klystrons are currently mothballed, but plans are afoot to use them in a new accelerator in Eastern Europe. (tc0554-8)

Page 113, first and second captions: Congresswoman Anna Eshoo is pictured in both photos, **not** Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi. (arc235 and arc 233)

Page 120, second caption: issue of Science Magazine is June 2001 (not April) (ssr128)

Page 123, add to Photographs Credit list: Nobel Foundation 45:3
